

### **Terry Fox Run - Tuesday September 21/21**

This year we will organize our Terry Fox Run on Tuesday, September 21th in accordance with AHS guidelines. Students will be running together as a school outside. We will be having two assemblies in the gym to teach about Terry's legacy and how we support the Terry Fox Foundation by running in his memory and donating money to support cancer research. ### National Day of Truth & Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day - Wednesday September 29/21

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission Residential School Commemoration Event held in Williams Lake in the spring of 2013. It grew out of residential school survivor Phyllis Webstad's account of losing the shiny new orange shirt her granny gave her on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an

opportunity to teach about the legacy of residential schools and anti-racism education in all Canadian schools. Orange



Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and community agencies to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come because 'every child matters'. Too add to the importance of reconciliation, September is now recognized as National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. As we learn together about this day, we invite all students to join our staff in wearing an orange shirt on September 29. In CESD, there is no school on September 30 to honor the work of reconciliation.

If you are new to our school, you will need to set up your child's account.
