- 4. Guest Speaker Raelynn Notley with Youth Empowerment and Support Program (YES)
- The YES program is a Mental Health Capacity Building Project funded by Alberta Health Services which began in Olds in 2007
- In 2019 they received an Expansion Grant through AHS and moved into the Communities of Delburne, Elnora, SpruceView, Bowden and Carstairs
- With funding support of local Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) and CESD, they
 have expanded to all communities within the Division in 2021
- There are 12 employees providing social and emotional support to children in classrooms no 1 on 1 individual coaching, (that is done by the family school wellness worker). Lindsey Noring is at our school and Nicole will be at Fox Run. This is a great transition for kids in Poplar Ridge to have the YES program here and then to carry over into Fox Run for their transition from Grade 6 7
- Success coaches work alongside teachers to help them create safe and caring classrooms where the topic of mental health and wellness is normalized and commonplace
- They practice Prevention not intervention
- They help students to understand the difference between healthy and unhealthy coping
- They help to Resolve conflict not interrupt
- They engage students in a safe environment through pro-social recreation to help them feel secure and increase their sense of belonging
- There is support provided to students in smaller, targeted groups, at lunch, after school and on collaborative day as well as throughout the summer
- The Mission is to promote positive mental health in children, youth families and individuals in the community who interact with children and youth

The Board supports this program and the YES staff are Division Employees. This year these Success Coaches were able to connect with 8076 students in 25 schools in 13 communities!
