Our Core Values Recognition Program

As a team, our staff has spent a great deal of time focusing on and intentionally teaching students how to apply our five **core values of relationship**, **respect**, **integrity**, **courage and excellence** in all aspects of school. This work began three years ago when we engaged our students in helping us design our **Core Values Wheel**. Like an Indigenous medicine wheel, it connects animal characteristics and action words to each value. This helps students connect their own behaviors, choices, actions and goals to our values. To acknowledge this important work, we have created a meaningful way to recognize students who set goals towards and demonstrate or "live" our core values consistently in all aspects of their school life. We have shared our thinking and plans with our School Council/PTA to get their feedback. They were very supportive of our attention to focusing on this aspect of student learning, as it supports academic, social and emotional growth for our students now and in the future. With their support, we are excited to share that we will begin the Poplar Ridge School Core Value Recognition Program for our students in January!

How will this work you ask? We will launch this with students in January at our first assembly and teachers will teach about it in class. Staff can nominate students who they see consistently demonstrating the characteristics of each core value in multiple settings at school. We have created cool key tags for each of the animals in our Core Value Wheel. The goal is for students to earn all of the key tags over the course of their time at PRS. Hopefully, they earn more than one of each! Each month at our assembly, we will celebrate students who have been nominated and have earned the **animal key tag of the value they are recognized** for! We know not all students are motivated by recognition, prizes or grades, but we feel that it is important to recognize students who demonstrate our values as it will hopefully instill a growth mindset that shows up in all aspects of their lives, in and out of school.

We have included our **Core Value Wheel** to the right so you can see which animal represents each core value, along with three words that we focus on to describe the behavior and attitudes that students should be demonstrating to meet it. We will be sending out info again in January so that you can review it with your child. We hope that by focusing on and recognizing what it looks like to live our core values at school, these will carry into our students lives beyond PRS!
